- 1. Over the course of your life, what are some positions you have changed your mind on? Take a few minutes and discuss it with your group.
- Rusty mentioned in his message the phrase, "Jesus, yes. Church, no". How do you feel about that statement? Have you ever felt that way at any time in your life? If so, explain.

DIGGING DEEPER

- 1. The conversion of Paul is one of the greatest stories ever told. He went from being a persecutor of Christians to a passionate missionary for the church. What factors contributed to his radical transformation?
- 2. Read **Acts 9:1-9**. What are some things about this passage that stand out to you? Why do you think Saul was struck blind?

What might God have been trying to teach him through blindness?

How do you think Saul felt when confronted by Jesus? Given his previous activities, what might he have been thinking about during those three days of blindness and fasting (v. 9)?

3. Early in the book of Acts, we see that the church was actively working to fulfill what Jesus told them to do in **Acts 1:1-9**. According to **Acts 2:42-47**, what was the church doing so that they began to see growth?

4. The Christians in the early church were devoted to teaching, fellowship, prayer and breaking bread. Why do you think Christians today struggle with this?
What could we do or stop doing that would allow us to have the margin in our lives to be as dedicated as they were?
What might happen if we did the things they did?
PRACTICAL APPLICATION
1. We live in a very consumer-centric world. Just as we read earlier, one of the things that helped the church see growth was the early church was selfless and sought to serve others. What do we need to do to fight against being consumers only?
2. In the sermon, Pastor Rusty challenged us to join in the mission of helping people find and follow Jesus. What steps can we take individually and as a group to actively participate in this mission with our church and broader community?
